



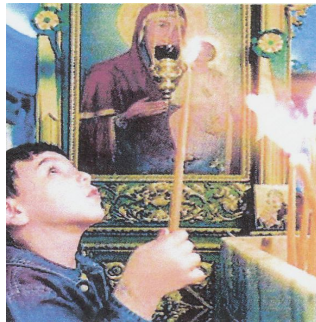

Opportunities to Serve:

A great need has been recognized for medical resources in the Holy Land where many are struggling under oppression, acute trauma, and poverty. We are working with hospitals, clinics, and mobile clinics in refugee camps, rural villages and other areas where we find people suffering because of a lack of medical care and supplies.

Medical Projects are developing in response to the awareness of the extremely limited primary health care that is available in many areas. Working through local medical facilities and community associations to identify most urgent needs, we host American medical teams to provide health care services and training in refugee camps and rural villages where adequate health care is not provided or accessible.

Dedicated professional analyze both acute and chronic health needs of these communities, assist and train local practitioners in current practices and procedures.

Other types of encounters and service projects are developed with various focus such as environment, economic development, labor issues, music and the Arts, cooking and culture.
